Features:

- Completely remove orders and related information
- Configure automatic order archiving
- Access order archive on a separate grid
- Hide archived orders on the frontend
- Delete or archive orders using API

Native Magento 2 settings don't support unwanted order deleting or hiding. With Delete Order, you'll manage to completely remove all the irrelevant orders with the corresponding information. Besides, you'll have a possibility to configure an automatic order grid clearance schedule to have it updated. The extension will help you enhance your store management and save time spent on order processing.

MAGENTO 2 DELETE ORDER FEATURES:

- **Remove irrelevant orders and corresponding data** from the order grid. Make sure the action won't cause any valuable data loss, as the action can't be reversed;
- **Archive unnecessary orders manually** to hide them from the frontend and the main grid;
- **Place the archived orders to a separate order grid** to clean up the main one;
- **Restore the archived orders** in several clicks;
- **Archive, delete or restore multiple orders** with all the related information;

- **Configure automatic order archivation** to save time. Set to archive orders automatically after a certain number of days, hourly, two-times per day, daily, weekly, monthly or by the statuses.

ADVANCED FEATURES

Enable your admin users to hide orders from customers' accounts;
Use API to delete, archive or restore orders.
